

Bible Readings for Sunday, November 24, 2024 Paregentan of the Fast of Advent

1 THESSALONIANS 1:1-10

Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus,

To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, with the bishops and deacons:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

THE HOLY GOSPEL OF JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO

LUKE 12:13-31

Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."

He said to his disciples, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat, or about your body, what you will wear. For life is more

than food, and the body more than clothing. Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? If then you are not able to do so small a thing as that, why do you worry about the rest? Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you you of little faith! And do not keep striving for what you are to eat and what you are to drink, and do not keep worrying. For it is the nations of the world that strive after all these things, and your Father knows that you need them. Instead, strive for his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well.

LITURGICAL CALENDAR AND NEWS FROM PRELACY CROSSROADS

"THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD": HONORING ARCHBISHOP ANOUSHAVAN'S 40 YEARS OF SERVICE



This Sunday, November 24, the Eastern Prelacy community in the United States will come together to celebrate a significant milestone: the 40th anniversary of His Eminence Archbishop Anoushavan Tanielian's service in America. The event, themed "The Lord is my shepherd" (Psalm 23:1), underscores the Archbishop's steadfast leadership and guiding principle in nurturing the spiritual lives of his parishioners over four decades. Fittingly, this celebration coincides with the beginning of a week when Americans reflect on gratitude and unity during Thanksgiving.

The day will begin with a Divine Liturgy at St. Sarkis Church in Douglaston, New York, followed by a banquet at Terrace on the Park in Corona, New York. Both events will center on thanksgiving for Archbishop Anoushavan's enduring dedication to faith and the Armenian people.

A native of Beirut, Archbishop Anoushavan began his spiritual journey at the Armenian Seminary of the Holy See of Cilicia in Antelias. After being ordained a celibate priest in 1972, he was sent to the United States in 1984 to continue his service, where he has since played a pivotal role in strengthening the Armenian Apostolic Church across the diaspora. As Prelate of the Eastern Prelacy since 2018, he has emphasized unity, education, and cultural preservation, while his leadership and faith have earned him the respect of his flock. The banquet's theme, "The Lord is my shepherd," underscores Archbishop Anoushavan's pastoral care and unwavering guidance of the Armenian community through triumphs and challenges, particularly over the past four years, which have been marked by significant and, at times, dramatic events. Throughout his tenure, Archbishop Anoushavan has consistently turned to this scripture as a source of strength and inspiration, emphasizing faith as the foundation of resilience.

The Divine Liturgy at St. Sarkis will provide a spiritual prelude to the day's celebrations, offering parishioners an opportunity for reflection and prayer. The banquet at Terrace on the Park will bring together clergy, community leaders, and parishioners to express their gratitude and honor a legacy of devotion.

In a time of global uncertainty, the celebration will highlight the enduring role of faith and leadership in preserving cultural identity as well as the spirit of gratitude, that most Christian of virtues. As His Eminence has expressed, "Jesus, as the Loving and Caring Son of God, as well as a true teacher, healer and our brother by human nature, brings us the greatest message that as the source of life, He is always ready to grant us the fullness of life, here and after."

This special day is expected to draw attendees from across the region, united in their appreciation for Archbishop Anoushavan's 40 years of dedicated service. We look forward to breaking bread with you on this joyous occasion.

THE NICENE CREED: A 10-PART BIBLICAL, HISTORICAL, AND THEOLOGICAL STUDY

The Nicene Creed (Havadamk), recited during the Divine Liturgy by Christians worldwide as the church's official statement of faith, was ratified by the 318 Fathers of the first Ecumenical Council held in Nicaea in 325 AD. Next year, 2025, marks the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, making it a fitting time to spotlight the teachings and legacy of the Nicene Creed in our educational programs. We are pleased to announce that this fall, the Eastern Prelacy will offer a 10-part virtual study on the Nicene Creed, presented by Dn. Shant Kazanjian, Director

THE SEASON OF ADVENT



This Sunday, November 24, is the first Sunday of Advent (from the Latin adventus, meaning "coming"). Advent is a season of penitence, anticipation, and preparation. Advent serves as a reminder of the original anticipation of the birth of Christ, as well as the anticipation for Christ's return. Ideally, Advent should be a time of quiet reflection and meditation. In modern times the period leading to Christmas is far from calm, and often is stressful and frenetic. It is a good time to remember to pause and reflect on the proper observation of the birth of our Lord and Savior.

In the true spirit of Christmas, remember that this time of the year, although filled with joy for most, can be lonely and sad for many people. Reach out to an elderly person living alone, someone who is ill, or someone who is mourning the loss of a loved one.

ADVENT IN ARMENIAN APOSTOLIC CHURCH

Did you know that the season of Advent has been on our Church calendar for centuries? If you did not know much about this season, it is never late to learn.

It is a period consisting of fifty days preceding the feast of Nativity of our Lord. It prescribes a spiritual discipline. During this time the faithful are admonished to prepare themselves worthily to celebrate the Lord's coming into the world as the incarnate love of God, and make their souls fitting abodes for him.

There are six Sundays in this season and each Sunday has a specific message:

Advent Week 1 (November 24): "Fight Against Greed" (Luke 12:13-31) Advent Week 2 (December 1): "Repent" (Luke 13:1-9) Advent Week 3 (December 8): "Be Charitable" (Luke 14:12-24) Advent Week 4 (December 15): "Be Forgiving" (Luke 17:1-10) Advent Week 5 (December 22): "Be Humble" (Luke 18:9-14) Advent Week 6 (December 29): "Invest Your Talents." (Luke 22:24-30)

TOGETHER WITH ARTSAKH ARMENIANS PRELACY'S STEADFAST SUPPORT FOR REFUGEES IN ARMENIA




Tens of thousands of Armenians from Artsakh have been forcibly expelled from their ancestral territory following the criminal policies of the Azerbaijani state and relocated to Armenia proper. While they are trying to solve their primary needs of housing, food, and other urgent issues, they also rely on the continuous help of the Diaspora. The Eastern Prelacy is providing monthly assistance to 30-35 families from Artsakh through the Hope and Light NGO.


You can make your donations to the Eastern Prelacy fundraiser Together with Artsakh Armenians by clicking the kink bekow.




On the occasion of the 10th anniversary of Der Mikael's ordination, the Sunday school created a Rock Garden by the entrance of the church.




