
PRAYER OF THE WEEK

1 JOHN 3:2-6

Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be, has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him.

THE HOLY GOSPEL OF JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO

JOHN 9:39 - 10:10

Jesus said, "I came into this world for judgment so that those who do not see may see, and those who do see may become blind." Some of the Pharisees near him heard this and said to him, "Surely we are not blind, are we?" Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would not have sin. But now that you say, 'We see,' your sin remains.

"Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

LITURGICAL CALENDAR AND NEWS FROM PRELACY CROSSROADS

H.H. ARAM I JOINS LEADERS
OF EASTERN CHURCHES IN CAIRO
TO MARK 1700TH ANNIVERSARY OF COUNCIL OF NICEA



Under the auspices of His Holiness Catholicos Aram I, His Holiness Pope Tawadros II, and His Holiness Patriarch Mor Ignatius Aphrem II, the 1700th anniversary of the First Ecumenical Council of Nicaea was celebrated on May 17 and 18, 2025, at the Coptic Orthodox Patriarchate in Cairo and at the Great Cathedral of St. Mark's.

The celebration included meetings among clergymen of the region's Oriental Orthodox Churches, a joint liturgy, and a spiritual concert.

Catholicos Aram I emphasized the historical significance of the First Ecumenical Council, highlighting its foundational role in Orthodox Christianity and the importance of the Nicene Creed.

With the blessing of His Holiness, the event was attended by Archbishops Gomidas Ohanian; Nareg Alyemezian; Shahan Sarkissian; Shahe Panossian; Magar Ashkarian; Mesrob Sarkissian; Torkom Donoyan; Bishops Sahag Yemishian; Bedros Manuelian; Dajad Ashekian, and Very Reverend Fathers Hovagim Panjarjian; Oshin Tchvalertanian, and Sarkis Aprahamian.

ARCHBISHOPS ANOUSHAVAN, KEGHAM REPRESENT HOLY SEE OF CILICIA AT POPE'S ENTHRONEMENT IN ROME



His Eminence Archbishop Anoushavan, Prelate, represented the Holy See of Cilicia at the enthronement of His Holiness Pope Leon XIV on Sunday, May 18, in Rome. The ceremony marked the official beginning of the newly elected Pontiff's tenure as head of the Catholic Church.

By directive of His Holiness Catholicos Aram I, Archbishop Anoushavan and His Eminence Archbishop Kegham, Prelate of the Western Prelacy, conveyed the greetings and fraternal prayers of the Armenian Catholicosate of the Great House of Cilicia to the new Pope. Their participation in this solemn occasion underscores the strong commitment of Catholicos Aram I to ecumenism. His Eminence Archbishop Anoushavan, making a pun on the words "wind" and "spirit," which share the same meaning in the Scriptures, remarked to Pope Leon XIV: "Your Holiness, since you are a child of the Windy City, I pray that throughout your pontificate the Holy Wind prevails more effectively upon mankind in general and most especially in the life of Christendom."

The Armenian Apostolic Church was further represented by delegates from the four hierarchical sees. From the Mother See of Holy

Etchmiadzin, the delegation included His Beatitude Archbishop Sahak, Armenian Patriarch of Constantinople, and His Eminence Archbishop Khajag, Pontifical Legate of Western Europe and representative of the Armenian Apostolic Church to the Holy See (Vatican). The Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem was represented by His Grace Bishop Koryoun and Chancellor Rev. Fr. Aghan Kokchian.

The Armenian Church delegation at the Pope's enthronement highlights the importance it places on continued dialogue with Rome at a particularly challenging time in global affairs and inter-church relations.

On Saturday, May 17, Archbishops Anoushavan and Kegham attended a reception organized by Archbishop Khajag in honor of Patriarch Sahak of Constantinople. On Sunday, May 18, following the inauguration ceremony, the Vatican hosted a reception to mark the installation of Pope Leo XIV. The same evening, the Armenian Apostolic Church delegates were hosted at the Pontifical Armenian College of Rome by Armenian Catholic Patriarch, His Beatitude Raphaël Bedros XXI, and his entourage.

FOR BREAD AND HOPE TOGETHER WITH ARTSAKH ARMENIANS



A hundred thousand Armenians from Artsakh have been forcibly expelled from their ancestral territory following the criminal policies of the Azerbaijani state and relocated to Armenia proper. ST. GREGORY OF DATEV INSTITUTE

One of the most popular programs of the Armenian Prelacy is the St. Gregory of Datev Institute Summer Program for youth ages 13-18, affectionately called "Datev". Sponsored and organized by the Prelacy's Christian Education Department, the St. Gregory of Datev Institute offers

a unique faith-based program for our youth in a wholesome and nurturing environment with three-pronged objectives: Christian education and formation, prayer and worship, and fellowship and recreational activities.

The comprehensive Christian educational program is completed in four years, one week each summer. Those who complete the program are offered the option to return for post-graduate classes. Each year, the students receive about 20 hours of instruction. The curriculum includes the Bible, the sacraments of the Armenian Church with emphasis on the Divine Liturgy (Soorp Badarak), Armenian Church feasts and saints, Armenian Church creeds and theology, prayer and worship, as well as discussions on contemporary moral and ethical issues.

The daily life of the students at Datev is framed by 20-30 minute morning and evening prayers. Every morning the students assemble at the chapel for the Aravodyan or the Arevakal service according to the tradition of the Armenian church, and at the close of the day, before retiring to their rooms, the students once again gather for the Compline (Husgoom) service.

The daily schedule of the Program is tempered by afternoon sports and recreational activities, as well as with special excursions, all aiming to foster positive and lasting friendships among the students.



Rev. Fr. Mikael Der Kosrofian Participates in National Peace Officers Memorial Day Service




Last Wednesday, Der Mikael was invited by the Milford Police Department to offer prayers on the occasion of National Peace Officers Memorial Day (also known as Police Week).

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy proclaimed May 15 as National Peace Officers Memorial Day and the calendar week in which May 15 falls, as National Police Week. Established by a joint resolution of

Congress in 1962, National Police Week pays special recognition to those law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others.

Der Hayr prayed for the souls of two of Milford's finest, Sgt. Walter Conley and Officer Harry Butler who were both killed in the line of duty, as well as for the souls of all fallen officers. He concluded the prayer asking God to bless and protect all of the men and women in the Milford Police Department as well as all officers who work to protect and serve their communities.

Northbridge, Massachusetts, will celebrates Memorial Day with a parade and other events. Here's what you can expect:





Home Blessings



Throughout history, Armenian Christians have considered the home to be a sacred place: the tranquil sanctuary of the family, where habits of virtue, pious traditions, and life-affirming customs are passed from one generation to another. Under one roof, members of a household achieve a unity of spirit and assume responsibility for the larger life of the community. They break bread and share life's joys and sorrows. Above all, the home is where one's faith in God is first kindled, and where that faith finds some of the most profound occasions for action. God's presence makes every family home a "Little Church" (in Greek, ecclesia), where His love and blessings permeate every corner. Through a special ceremony, we ask God to bless our homes on occasions like the Nativity and Resurrection of Christ, as well as on the joyous occasion of moving into a new home. It's called the Dounohrnek, or Home Blessing service.

During a Home Blessing, the priest takes with him wafer and incense. He blesses bread, water, and salt: three fundamental elements essential for human life. The priest asks God not to lessen these three gifts, without which life becomes impossible or imperfect.

The bread, water, and salt are symbols of God's infinite goodness and care.

Bread, which symbolically represents the Word of God, grants life to all those who taste it.

Salt seasons our food, making it delicious and edible. Metaphorically, salt represents man in this world with his words and deeds; Christ said, "You are the salt of the earth." Man's life should be seasoned with wisdom, moderation, or a sense of sufficiency.

Finally, **Water**, the essential element of life, represents cleanliness. Through the water of baptism, we are cleansed, renewed in Christ, and united with our God.

Alongside the bread, salt, and water offered on a tray by the home-dwellers, the priest places the wafer stamped with a crucifix and designs of grapes and wheat. The wafer signifies the presence of Christ in the home. The members of the family can either distribute the wafer among themselves or keep it in a jar along with flour, salt, or rice.

During a Home Blessing, it is customary to burn incense, symbolizing the burning of our souls with our Lord's love. In his prayer the Psalmist said: "Let my prayer be counted as incense before Thee."

In the prayer of the Home Blessing the priest first asks for purity and abundance of the three gifts. Then he blesses the home and all its inhabitants, asks God to keep them away from visible and invisible enemies, and prays that God will protect them and grant them health of soul and body.
