



Father's Day

JAMES 5:16-20

Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. LITURGICAL CALENDAR AND NEWS FROM PRELACY CROSSROADS

CATHOLICOS ARAM I CALLS FOR RENEWAL AND ENGAGEMENT



In his traditional address to the National Representative Assembly of the Prelacy, His Holiness Catholicos Aram I reflected on the importance of tradition, the mission of the Armenian Church, and renewal. Below is the full text of his message, delivered via pre-recorded video during the opening session of the assembly:

I greet you with fatherly blessing and in the spirit of Christian love. You are gathered together once again as representatives of our church and people to assess the work of the Prelacy and set the priorities for the next period.

In fact, in order to look forward with renewed faith and firm engagement, we need to look backward, namely to the work that has been done, with its achievements and failures. What the church does is a God given and people-oriented mission, a mission which is articulated through education, social service and pastoral care. These dimensions and spheres of the church's mission should acquire top priority on your agenda.

We are living in a world which is in constant change and transformation. Therefore, our church's mission in all its aspects and manifestations should be relevant and in tune with the realities of the modern world.

The church does not live in isolation; it is an integral part of society. The church is called to become a bridge builder between its faithful and society, preserving its core values.

As you know, I have declared this year as the Year for the Renewal of Traditions. Tradition is the expression of a community's or religion's spiritual and cultural characteristics, its ways of life, its aspirations and self-understanding. Religions, churches or communities are often identified by their traditions.

Tradition is, indeed, a strong identity marker. It is also a bond between the present and the past; it ensures continuity; tradition is the expression of unity: people are connected to each other through their common tradition.

I cannot imagine a community, religion or a church in the United States which has no traditions. We must remain faithful to our own traditions. The apostle Paul says, stand firm and cling to the traditions (Thes 2: 15). Our traditions need to be renewed and revitalized and become compatible with new realities and conditions. I believe that our families, our organizations and particularly our church have an instrumental role to play in terms of preserving our traditions and transmitting them to the generations to come.

My recent visits to our parish churches helped me to have a better understanding of our church and community and the concerns and challenges they face.

I believe that the working relationship between the Prelacy and parish churches needs to be further organized through mutual visits and joint initiatives. On the parish level, the church needs to increase its membership and through people– oriented action programs involve the parishioners in the life and witness of the church. The role of clergy is crucial in renewing and revitalizing the life of the church.

And finally, I look forward to seeing you in November on the occasion of the celebration of the 30th anniversary of my pontifical ministry.

I would like to express my great appreciation to His Eminence Archbishop Anoushavan for his dedicated service. My appreciation is also due to the clergy, Executive Council and the National Representative Assembly for their committed engagement in the service of our church.

May God bless you and lead you in your deliberations and decisions.

REMEMBRANCE OF THE PROPHET ELIJAH



This Sunday, June 15, the Armenian Church remembers Elijah, one of the greatest prophets of the Old Testament recorded in 1 and 2 Kings. He appeared along with Moses at the Transfiguration as the prophet of life and the new covenant. The Armenian Church (like all the Eastern churches) holds Elijah in the highest esteem. Most importantly, Elijah did not experience death; he was taken to heaven, like the Holy Mother of God. He is mentioned in the Armenian hymn Ee Verin Yerousaghem, sung during the Requiem Service.

"Receive us in Jerusalem above, in the dwellings of the angels, in Eden, the paradise where Enoch and Elijah live worthily resplendent in dovelike purity and in old age. O merciful Lord, have mercy upon the souls of ours who have fallen asleep."

SAINTS HRIPSIME AND GAYANE AND THEIR COMPANIONS



This Monday and Tuesday, June 16 and 17, the Armenian Church commemorates the virgin saints Hripsime and Gayane and their companions. Thirty-three nuns, led by Gayane, left Rome and sought refuge in Armenia hoping to escape the Roman Emperor who desired one of the nuns, the beautiful Hripsime. In Armenia, King Dertad became captivated by Hripsime's beauty and sought to wed her. She refused. Enraged, the king had Hripsime (and the other nuns) imprisoned and tortured to death. When Gregory was released from his imprisonment in the deep pit (Khor Virab) he built chapels over the relics of the nuns, which Catholicos Sahag Bartev renovated in the 4th century. During the 7th century, churches were built over both sites. The church dedicated to Hripsime, built by Catholicos Gomidas, is considered an architectural masterpiece and influenced the future course of Armenian architecture. Catholicos Gomidas also wrote a sharagan (hymn) in their memory—the well-known Antsink Nviryalk (Dedicated Beings).

Archaeological excavations in 1979 confirmed that Hripsime and some of her companions were indeed buried beneath its walls. There is a portrait of Hripsime painted on the lid of the sarcophagus where her relics now reside, in the magnificent edifice that memorializes her name.

The two churches, as well as a third (Shoghakat), are in the city of Etchmiadzin (Vagharshapat), not far from the complex of buildings that comprise the Holy Mother See of Etchmiadzin, designated by UNESCO as a World Heritage site.



Fatherhood: Privilege, Duty, Blessing

Sunday will be observed as Father's Day across the United States: a chance to reflect, with gratitude, on the deeper meaning of fatherhood.

While the surrounding popular culture often fails to treat fatherhood with due seriousness, the Armenian Church accords great reverence and respect to fathers.

The greatest tribute we pay to fatherhood lies in the way we apply the word "Father" to God. Our ability to call upon Him as our Father is a privilege and blessing—beautifully conveyed in a prayer from our Divine Liturgy:

"God of truth and Father of mercy, we are grateful that you have exalted us above even the Old Testament patriarchs. For you were called 'God' to them; but you are pleased to be named 'Father' to us."

The priest recites this prayer right before the congregation sings the Hayr Mer—reminding us that it was Jesus, God's only-begotten Son, who taught us to call God "Our Father." And when we understand God in terms of His Fatherhood, we also understand godliness to be the duty to which all fathers are called.

This Sunday, thank the fathers who strive to provide such an example in your own life, and remember in your prayers those who have departed this world.

Blessing Service of 2025 Graduates




On Sunday June 8th following Badarak, a special blessing prayer service took place for the 2025 graduates.






Zabel DerKosrofian

He will be attending Stonehill College in thr Fall of 2025. He will be majoring in Secondary education with a minor in history.



What Can We Do?

Soorp Asdvadzadzin Church of Whitinsville is committed to helping in any way we can. We have undertaken a new humanitarian effort to provide fresh food, groceries, and toiletries to the families who have either lost a soldier to the Artsakh war, or families who have a wounded hero who cannot work to support their family and the families from Artsakh who have recently been forced to relocated by Azerbaijan to Armenia.

The program is simple. We order Groceries online from the supermarket in Armenia, which are paid for here in the United States. The groceries are delivered the next day to the families. In addition to the families we have "adopted", we have started to help several families from Artsakh who are now living in villages in Armenia.


